Difference Between City Water Vs Well Water

Currently each resident in Evergreen has Well Water. This involved drilling a well at some point to access a water table suitable for use. You then needed a pump & bladder tank. working together, to provide enough pressure to the home for it to be usable. Some people then filter the water to remove things like hardness and iron contents. This provided safer water for the residents and helped protect things like plumbing pipes and plumbing fixtures like water heaters. This involves monthly maintenance as well as replacement cost on pumps, filtration, bladder tanks, ect.

City water is very simple. It is provided by the municipality to each resident's home through a metered device. This device records usage and then that amount is billed monthly based on the rates provided by the municipality. There are no pumps needed due to the pressure coming from the municipality supply. The water is treated to state standards to ensure the water is safe. If there is an interruption in service or safety issue, the municipality will alert you accordingly. You can see the water quality by looking up the annual reports done by the municipality. Responsibility is split like this: Anything before the meter is them and anything after is your responsibility.

What Do I Do With My Existing Water Filtration System?

You have a few options when it comes to your existing Water Filtration System & Pump:

- Completely Eliminate the system and save on maintenance cost, electric and SALTTTTT!
- 2) Continue to use the filtration system just for your irrigation, still coming from the well. This would just treat the water that is watering your plants from the well. Keeping the orange stains away!
- You could hook up your irrigation to city water as well, but remember it is monitored by usage, so your monthly bill would be more.
- Lastly, you could keep the system in and add carbon filters to additionally treat the city water.

Notes

- You will only need your pump if you are keeping your well for your irrigation.
- You will only need your filtration system if you want to still treat any water.

Do I Need to Treat City Water?

You may not need a whole house filtration system for city water, as it is legally required to meet safety standards. It is more of a question on preference and sensitivity to the water supply. You may want to improve taste, address disinfectants like CHLORINE & CHLORAMINE, prevent scale build up, address the smaller amounts of hardness, or get an extra layer of protection against contaminants that can enter the water supply after the

Treatment Plant. Your existing system will still treat things like hardness and scale build up. It will not remove Chlorine, Chloramine, and other disinfectants unless a Carbon filter is present. The good news is you can add to your existing system or go with something completely different that requires less maintenance and monthly cost. There are several options available if you are concerned with the water quality.



My Water Heater

Rule of Thumb:

Every water heater, whether tank or tankless, should be flushed annually. This removes sediment from tank heaters and protects tankless heaters from scale build up. When switching from well water to city water, we highly recommend a flushing of your heater to truly give your home a fresh start, moving forward.



Fun Facts:

- 1) Typically, pressure coming from a well is between 40-60psi. City water pressure is usually between 60-80, meaning you should have better water pressure by switching to City Water.
- 2) We all know about the infamous orange stains on the side of our house and on our side walks. This is caused by iron being in the water supply. Good news is you will not have any of that with City water, as it is removed when treated by the municipality.
